SCHEDULE "A"

LOCAL LAW NO. 2 of the Year 1992 NOISE CONTROL

Section 1. This local law shall be known as the "Noise Control Law of the Town of Piercefield".

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to make or cause or permit to be made any unreasonable noise, including any person who permits unreasonable noise to be made on his or her property or on property under his or her control. Unreasonable noise is defined as any excessive or loud sound which disturbs, injures or endangers the peace, comfort, order, repose or health of a neighborhood or the public.

Section 3. Upon the trial of any complaint alleging a violation of Section 2 of this Local Law, the Court shall consider at least the following:

- a. The intensity of the noise.
- b. The duration of the noise.
- c. The nature and the zoning district of the area within which the alleged violation occurred.
- d. The time of day or night the alleged violation occurred.
- e. The proximity of the complaining person or persons to the premises or the location of the alleged violation.
- Section 4. The violation of this Local Law shall be an offense punishable, upon conviction thereof, as provided herein.
- Section 5. Upon conviction, a violator of this law shall be subject to punishment by a fine not exceeding \$100.00, or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding ten days or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- Section 6. Each separate provision of this law shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and if any provision(s) shall be deemed or declared invalid, all of the provisions hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.
- Section 7. This local law shall take effect immediately.
