67) <u>Highway Report</u>

Highway Superintendent Jay Rust reported Jon Chesbrough only has 2 CDL classes left at CVTEC; he will be taking his road test the week of the 22nd. The Highway Department has started sweeping the roads, sweeping is almost finished in Conifer. They have also been cutting and splitting wood; one wood shed is already filled in preparation for winter. Jay has asked the town board to take a drive through conifer. Conifer was last paved around 1985 and is showing many signs of wear and tear along with erosion from flooding over the culverts. Depending on what he receives for CHIPS money he would like to pave conifer. Deputy Town Supervisor Carol Dimond mentioned how there is a big hole on Racquette Flow Rd where it meets with Route 3. Carol would like to know if that area would be added to the plan for paving. Jay informed the board that this area had been paved in the past but then got tore up. He will contact Gary Lutz head of DOT out of Cranberry Lake to request an apron be put down where the two roads meet. Jay needs approval to order calcium for the gravel roads. 4 ton from Taylor Rental is \$2,713.50 which includes delivery while 4 ton from Midstate without delivery is \$3,355.20.
